Council Notes

APRIL 2020

The council met April 20, 2020 via ZOOM. This was our first meeting held remotely. It was a bit different but seemed to work just fine and did enable us to conduct business as usual. Thanks to Tiffany for setting this up and “hosting” the meeting. The most impactful issue dealt with was our participation in the government paycheck protection program.

It had been brought to our attention that nonprofits including churches were eligible to take advantage of the loan program designed to help businesses and other organizations to keep people on their payroll rather than lay them off. The executive board met electronically and authorized our business manager to begin the application process. Thanks to her and the assistance of Mike Stamp at Peoples Bank, our application was approved prior to those funds being exhausted. The full council then approved our participation in this program. We will be receiving a forgivable loan in the amount of \$47,600. This amount is based on our payroll costs including payroll taxes and benefits for a period of two months. No collateral was required for this loan and as long as at least 75% of it is used to keep people on our payroll the total amount will be forgiven. Thanks to all of you our giving has continued at close to “normal” levels but it was felt that continued time with no in person worship could adversely effect contributions. This loan will provide us with a buffer against that possibility. The feeling of the council is that if our giving is sufficient such that we have a surplus after we get back to “normal” that we will be able to then determine how best to use those surplus funds to support causes that will need lots of help as a result of this virus.

In the meantime, our ministries continue. Thanks to our great staff for adapting so well and using new ways to keep us connected.

If there is one thing COVID-19 has taught us, it is the power and importance of prayer. Praying for our loved ones is a great ministry here at First Lutheran and we would like to update our list and invite others to join in our Prayer Chain Ministry. First Foodies:

Bagel Recipe (3 to 5 hours, start to finish) *By: Pastor Joel Bacon*

Combine and let sit for a few minutes

1-1/2 Cups Warm Water

1 TBSP Yeast

3 TBSP Sugar

OR: 3 TBSP Maple Syrup

OR: 3 TBSP Honey

Combine dry ingredients

1 TBSP Salt

4-1/4 Cups Flour

OR: 2 Cups Flour plus 2-1/4 Cups

Whole Wheat Flour

OR: 2 Cups Flour plus 2 Cups Whole

Wheat Flour plus 1/2 Cup Steel Cut Rolled Oats

Add dry ingredients to the yeast mixture one cup at a time and fold and knead until you have a uniform dough ball. Let rise until doubled.

Roll out on floured board and cut or form 12 flat round pieces. Poke hole in center and form each one into a doughnut and place on parchment paper lined jelly roll pan. Let rise until 50% bigger.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Place in boiling water for one minute, flip and boil for another minute, then place back on parchment paper lined jelly roll pan. Note: water must be sufficient depth for the bagel to float freely.

Bake at 350 degrees, on parchment paper lined jelly roll pan, until just starting to turn brown. Remove and immediately brush with egg white. Baking time varies based on which dough mixture used so you need to watch.

Note: just before the final baking the bagels are extremely sticky and things like dried onion, poppy seeds, sesame seeds, etc., may be added at that time and then finished in the oven. Also, bagels are extremely moist and homemade bagels have no preservatives so, though very tasty, they do not 'keep' maybe as long as you are accustomed to.
