From the Pastor's Desk

I was learning to ski on Lake Wissota outside Chippewa Falls and it was the summer of 1986. I was with some counselors from Luther Park Bible Camp and one of their Grandpas. I had met some lengthy sturgeon, had ingested about a gallon of lake water, both from swallowing and nasal gavage and hadn't yet managed to ski. I was in the rocking chair position, I was always ready to go, but once the horsepower got added my limbs all went higgledy-piggledy. Had we been trolling for sharks I might have been an effective bait. All I remember was the disorienting amount of splashing and foaming and pulling all around me. My fellow counselor's grandpa was kind of a lovable curmudgeon who had been quite quiet as my struggles ate up a good portion of the hour. Though I had been receiving encyclopedic amounts of advice from my fellow counselors the old man had remained mum. He finally spoke: "FOLLOW THE BOAT!" He added an adverb and an adjective that I am not allowed to say since my ordination but you get the idea. In an imperative voice, he told me to follow the boat. The simplest advice was the best. Next try I was waterskiing. And every try after that.

When my focus was short and on all the things that could go wrong within my sacred personal bubble my attention was drawn in all sorts of little and contradictory directions. When my focus was on the boat, 90 feet away, my focus simply allowed me to ride through all the little shimmies and shakes, and suddenly I was on the water scooting along at 20 some miles per hour. And think about it, if the boat was the source of the power that made skiing possible, was it really possible to not follow it?

I have never forgotten that grandpa's simple and sage advice. It has become one of my maxims – Follow the Boat. It means to have a long focus. There are lots of folk tales about the difference between thinking in the short term and thinking in the long term. The Three Little Pigs, the Pied Piper of Hamelin, Chicken Little, the Hare, and the Tortoise, and many others like them have this theme of how a long focus is better than a short one, and how responding is better than reacting. But the other thing about Follow the Boat is recognizing where the power comes from. If you are not cooperating with the one supplying the power you are probably not going anywhere useful.

Whenever I have observed conflict over the years one thing I have often noticed is an abundance of personal agendas but a lack of common focus. I have seen service organizations bicker and fade to irrelevance because they lost their sense of common mission. When these service organizations started everyone clearly knew why they gathered and what their purpose was but over time the power of that common focus had been lost. No longer following the source of the founding power they floundered. I was recruited to be a member of a service organization and I went to one of their meetings. The business meeting was a five-minute check on the conditions of finances and then they got down to eating and schmoozing. When asked later if I wanted to join I said, "I already know how to drink and play cards." A once proud civic organization had become a club where the men ate the foods their wives wouldn't let them eat anymore while they drank, played cards, and told off-color jokes. That only happens by not following the boat.

Now I know that this metaphor has its weaknesses like “What if the captain is untrustworthy?” or “What about Jet-Skis?” All metaphors have holes in them. But still, it is fair to say that any focus that is too close or too inward kind of makes us useless to the larger community. During the Reformation, the reformers came up with a Latin phrase to describe Sin and it was “in curvatus se” which means “curved in on self.” It is an accurate description of the general lack of awareness we have of the bigger picture because our own wants and worries are all we can think about. I have a friend who calls to ask how I am as a pretext to talk about himself for two hours. And after two hours of hearing someone say “I” and “me” relentlessly I find I am worn out and unfocused. That Latin phrase reminds us that we are all interrelated and any sort of self-absorption hurts us all.

One thing Follow the Boat does is it reminds me that I do not go in my own power. If I am skimming along, enjoying the thrill, it is only because someone else is supplying the power, steering, and avoiding the obstacles. Whether it is the unique freedoms I have as an American, or the ultimate freedom I have from sin and death because of the Cross, all that I have that is good comes from a power much greater than me.




