From the Pastor's Desk

When you grow up in a place where most of your family lore is in a place where you were educated and met the love of your life and all of your children were born in that place, and when that place is beautiful, you are going to miss that place. That's OK. Going to new places and hearing the new stories and learning the new ways are what make us grow. But I still miss the River Rats. The River Rats were those largely unmarried men (God being merciful and kind) who trapped and fished and avoided the IRS along the extensive Mississippi River and its backwaters in the Driftless Region that birthed me. These guys had a lot of sayings, five percent of which are repeatable in Church, but one of my favorites was, "You never fish the same river twice." They knew that Old Man River was a living entity with moving sandbars and changing structures, fluctuations in fish populations, and spawning conditions, that caused it to constantly be in flux. People would catch fish in a certain spot and go back there and not find the fish again and say, "There aren't the bluegills there used to be. DNR keeps messing with things." It's always the DNRs fault it seems. The River Rats knew that there were still bluegills, you just had to find them, because you never fish the same river twice. Living things change. You can either adapt or be miserable. You can either be intrigued by the mystery and the challenge of the now or be trapped in the prison called nostalgia. And nostalgia is a prison. But that is a whole other article..... You never fish the same river twice. Do you ever go to the same Church twice? I wonder. Churches have personalities and they change. Every time the snowbirds start migrating south the personality of First Lutheran changes. Every time First takes on new members the personality of the congregation changes. Every year the personality of the council changes. It is all because the Church is a living entity made up of people whom themselves are changing. And as external factors change and pressure the Church, different leaders with different skills need to step forward. As people come forward with their ideas and dreams and experiences and risk sharing them, and as a task force or committee takes on this expression of this personality, the church finds itself doing something it had never done before. And this is as it should be. The Church is not a static entity trying to press people with a certain mold or cutter to make everyone the same. The Church is a living being full of wondrous and diverse personalities whose skills and energy and faith constantly reshape the Church. That's the real reason the core cohesive value of the Church is Acceptance and Forgiveness, and not conformity and control. A healthy congregation sees every person as a gift from God who has been uniquely blessed by God to be useful in a special way. When this happens.....wow!


Operation Christmas 2022

6 Locations of Ministry (places for shaping faith)

Children and Youth - Children and youth, recognized and empowered as disciples of Jesus Christ, use their God-given gifts in purposeful ministry.

Homes - Families are equipped & strengthened by their congregation to be the primary nurturers of faith.

Congregations - Congregations are safe, inclusive, welcoming, and nurturing for all children, youth, and adults, as they live out their faith in the midst of community and the larger world.

Community - Christians live their faith daily, experiencing Christ in Community, learning from it, as well as serving the needs of the community.

Culture - Children, youth, and adults experience God's presence, learning from people from a variety of Cultures while being part of God's transformational work within the culture.

Creation - Christians live in harmony with Creation, recognizing, receiving, celebrating, and caring for God's handiwork.

5 Principles of a Vibrant Church (for passing on faith)

- Faith is formed by the power of the Holy Spirit through personal trusted relationships – often in our own homes.
- The church is a living partnership between the ministry of the congregation and the ministry of the home.
- Where Christ is present in faith, the home is church too.
- Faith is caught more than it is taught.
- If we want Christian children and youth, we need Christian adults.

All of our groups are open to anyone who has experienced the loss of a loved one. They are led by Regional Hospice Services caring staff and offered at no charge. No reservation is required. They firmly believe that grief shared is grief lessened.


